THINK SAFETY FIRST!

What makes us different? Every employee from the owner of the company to the field worker is empowered to call a "time out" if they reasonably believe they have been asked to perform a task that is unsafe. Our safety culture at U.S. Inspection & Non-Destructive Testing is to identify possible risks, implement measures to prevent potential injuries and accidents and achieve our goal of zero workplace injuries and accidents 24/7.

The Executive Management of U.S. Inspection & Non-Destructive Testing takes great responsibility in protecting our employees' health, safety & the environment. We continue to support our customers and our relentless commitment to quality and service is stronger than ever.

At U.S. Inspection & Non-Destructive Testing we promote a **Safety-First** culture with a clear objective: **Nobody Gets Hurt and no damage to the Environment.** The Environmental Health & Safety of our employees and customers is not just a priority, but rather a **core value** that never gets bumped down on the priority list. We are working in collaboration with our customers and following all federal, state, and local authorities to identify any potential hazards and take the necessary corrective actions to mitigate and prevent any risks of spreading the novel coronavirus [COVID-19].

The bottom line: No matter what crisis the world faces, hardworking employees at U.S. Inspection & Non-Destructive Testing continue to respond to the needs of our customers without compromising the Health and Safety of our fellow-workers and the community. While those needs continue to evolve, W.S. Inspection & Non-Destructive Testing remains committed to getting the job done in the safest manner possible and maintaining compliance with all applicable standards outlined by the [C.D.C] Centers for Disease Control and Prevention, Federal, State and Local Authorities.

- o A cough.
- Sore throat and fever (high temperature).
- o Trouble breathing.
- o Persistent pain or pressure in the chest.
- o New confusion or inability to arouse.
- Bluish lips or face.
- o Chills.
- o Repeated shaking with chills.
- o Headache.
- Muscle pain.
- o New loss of taste or smell.
- o Flu-like symptoms (While these symptoms are not always associated with influenza, it pays to err on the side of caution).
- Any employee that have come into contact with anyone [family member, co-worker, friend, neighbor etc.] who has tested positive for the COVID-19 virus should stay away from work for a period of 14 days following the last known contact.
- o Mass public transport by buses, trains, light rail, subways, etc. is prohibited.
- o Cruise ship travel is prohibited and travel to states identified by the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (C.D.C) as experiencing ongoing widespread community transmission is prohibited. These states currently include: New York, New Jersey and Connecticut.

The C.D.C recommends wearing homemade cloth or fabric face coverings in public settings where other social distancing measures are difficult to maintain, except to the extent an employee is using break time to eat or drink, in accordance with the Pennsylvania Department of Health. All non-essential visitors is prohibited from entering the work-space.

Social Distancing shall be maintained a distance of 6 feet whenever possible and practical [including breaks when eating or drinking]. No hand shaking or other touching such as fist bumps etc.



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Avoid touching your face with unwashed hands. Germs are often spread when a person touches something that is contaminated with germs and then touches his or her eyes, nose and mouth. Cover your mouth and nose with a tissue or elbow when coughing or sneezing. It may prevent those around you from getting sick. Avoid close contact with people who are sick.

- U.S Inspection & Non-Destructive Testing has instituted the following flexible work policies to address the COVID-19 disease. However, this written document is applicable to not just COVID-19, but any pandemic: As the needs of our customers continue to evolve, we will take the necessary corrective actions to mitigate and prevent any risks of spreading the COVID-19, or any other disease.
 - 1) Work at home, stay-at-home policy when employees are ill, or are caring for others. [Where Necessary] Employees will be required to stay at home when ill, when taking care of family members who are ill, or when caring for children when schools are closed, without fear of reprisals.
- 2) In the event of significant employee absenteeism or changes in business operation as a result of the COVID-19 pandemic, US Inspection & Non-Destructive Testing has mechanisms in place to maintain effective continuity of business practices which includes tele-commuting and other work-related home strategies.
- 3) All employees will be provided time-off work to obtain the necessary vaccines or immunizations when vaccines becomes available to avoid and prevent the spread of the COVID-19 disease.
- 4) U.S Inspection & Non-Destructive Testing has advised all employees to contact the Health & Safety Manager/Corporate Management as soon as the employee exhibit any signs or symptoms of the COVID-19.
- 5) U.S Inspection & Non-Destructive Testing communication strategies relative to the COVID-19 pandemic is continuously monitored and articulated to ensure 100% compliance and adherence to our stated goal of avoiding and preventing the spread of the coronavirus.
- 6) U.S Inspection & Non-Destructive Testing, Health & Safety department is following all CDC guidelines and will implement corrective actions to mitigate and prevent the spread of the COVID-19.

At U.S. Inspection & Non-Destructive Testing, we prioritize the development of each one of our employees. It begins with recruiting exceptional talent and continues with individually planned assignments and experiences that lead to broad skill development and a deep understanding of our businesses.
